This type of advocacy is Venture's top priority now, as is raising awareness of just how important direct care jobs are in this country. The professionals who do this vital work, and do it so well, are more than just nice

people helping those in need. They are a highly skilled and dedicated workforce that is also a key economic driver in Massachusetts and across the United States. Venture will strive non-stop to make everyone outside of the human services industry aware of just how talented and critical our workforce is, as well as how long overdue appropriate compensation truly is for them. It is high time that our society recognizes direct care employees for the accomplished and dedicated professionals that they are and always have been.

In addition to our advocacy, Venture heads into the third decade of this century fully committed to making a difference in the lives of others. Our programs continue to evolve, as does our work in the community. Venture offers more free events to people living with autism and disabilities than ever before and we continue to create opportunities for the individuals in our programs to be vibrant members of the community where they live. Venture takes great pride in the exceptional efforts of its direct support workforce. Our employees are what make it possible to fulfill our mission and we are committed to providing support and recognition to staff members of all levels. Our main goal is to invest in our employees, which will ultimately lead to the improvement of services for the individuals we support and contribute to the professionalization of the human services industry. This year, the agency has been working to enhance the Employee Recognition Program which includes department-specific appreciation days, contests with prizes, anniversary gifts, an Excellence in Direct Support Award that is presented at our annual Wine & Beer Festival, the employee thank-you card program, which allows colleagues to show appreciation for each other and be recognized among their peers, and more. The dedicated staff newsletter highlights all the great work being done in our individual programs, and offers yet another opportunity for staff members to be recognized for their incredible work. Venture is dedicated to fostering staff growth and development as demonstrated in this year's Staff Spotlight. We are pleased to recognize the accomplishments of five dedicated house managers who began their careers together as direct support professionals at our Highland Street residence. Today, five years later, each of these dedicated employees has been promoted and is now in charge of leading their own programs and teams. #### LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY

Venture is deeply invested in strengthening the human services workforce. Our agency employs nearly 600 direct support professionals who provide emotional, recreational, medical, behavioral, and physical support to hundreds of individuals. This number only represents a sliver of the people working in similar positions in other agencies across the Commonwealth. Nationally, the human services workforce is experiencing a 45% turnover rate, which threatens the stability of services. We are committed to helping manage the human services workforce crisis on a national stage, which means working with members of Congress and advocacy organizations to represent our employees. Direct support professionals are what make it possible to provide quality services 365 days a year – these employees are skilled, trained professionals and we are working diligently to promote the human services workforce and in turn secure the highest quality services. Venture works closely with the Association of Developmental Disability Providers, The Providers' Council and the national advocacy organization ANCOR (American Network of Community Options and Resources) to promote the best possible services for the individuals we support and the professionalization of the human services industry. We represent the unique interests of our workforce by advocating for better wages, access to healthcare, student loan reimbursement and more.

#### **CONTRIBUTING in the COMMUNITY**

Both our day programs and our residences are committed to providing services through unique programming, activities and community involvement. We recognize that every person we support is an individual with their own set of needs, interests, preferences and health concerns. Venture works with each individual on a case-by-case basis to help determine their unique abilities. Between the Sturbridge and Uxbridge day programs, Venture's participants provide 8 hours of volunteer meal delivery for local seniors weekly. The Uxbridge day program provides support at a local cat shelter, helping to clean, organize, feed the animals and offer much-needed attention to the cats waiting for their "forever homes". Several residential programs in Dudley teamed up to fill some back-to-school backpacks for local children in need and our Paxton residents help out every weekend at a free medical clinic. Some of our programs have visited nursing homes to provide companionship to seniors in our community. Many residents are members of churches, health clubs and social clubs. Individuals also have the opportunity to participate as rider athletes with the world-renowned Team Hoyt in road races across Massachusetts. At Venture, we recognize that true community involvement can be achieved through giving back and helping our neighbors.

# **Community Outreach Program**









Venture is proud to report that the Community Outreach Program has grown tremendously within the past year. The goal of this unique program is to provide free social and recreational opportunities to both adults and children with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including autism.

This initiative began three years ago with free adaptive yoga classes, which quickly grew in popularity. Today, Venture provides two free yoga classes per month to children in the Blackstone Valley community. The children's portion of the program also offers monthly therapeutic drum circles and live music, family fun events, cooking classes and craft programs. The free family fun events are sensory-friendly and geared toward kids with autism and their families. Our Halloween event offers practice trick-or-treating, crafts and sensory activities. The annual spring event gives kids the opportunity to experiment with different types of exercise, music and yoga as well as meeting animals. Not only do these events give kids access to fun activities in a safe and supportive environment, it also provides opportunities for them to meet friends and for their parents to connect with one another.

During the past year, Venture has begun offering events for adults with disabilities in the community, too. More than 50 participants enjoyed both our spring and fall paint nights hosted by Brush It Off Paint & Sip in Sturbridge, as well as a summertime herb garden project and Thanksgiving centerpiece creation, both hosted by Bemis Farms Nursery of Spencer. We also welcomed more than 130 individuals to our first annual Luau this past July and we are eagerly awaiting the Winter Wonderland dance in December. While attending their day programs, individuals supported by Venture also have access to projects with local artists, yoga classes, tai chi classes and therapeutic drum circles.






