Our merger with fellow provider Life-Skills, Inc. of Webster was effective July 1, 2024. This marks a strategic union with Venture continuing as the sole entity led by Mike Hyland as President & CEO of the combined organization. Life-Skills CEO Tom Amick will be retiring after 38 years of dedicated leadership.

Venture and Life-Skills have a long-standing relationship built on shared goals, values, and mission to provide high-quality support to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The combined organization will employ over 1,000 people, support close to 600 people with disabilities statewide, and have an annual operating budget of \$66 million.

"This merger represents an exciting time for Venture and Life-Skills," said Hyland. "It allows us to grow together in forming an elite human services agency that is innovative, impactful, and successful."
